Update on damage due to the Tōhoku region Pacific Ocean offshore earthquake (No.2)

As an update to our first announcement regarding the damage due to the Tohoku region Pacific Ocean offshore earthquake dated March 14, 2011, we would like to inform you about the results of our internal investigation on the current situation.

1. Employee situation

No company employees nor their family members who live together with them have been injured. However we have not been able to contact some of their family members who live separately in the affected areas. We are continuously trying to confirm their safety.

2. Plant situation

Some of the buildings, equipments and products at our facilities in the Tohoku and Kanto area have been damaged. Giving top priority to the safety of our employees, now we are working together with all-out effort to resume normal operations at the earliest stage. However there are still some possibilities that our operations will be influenced by secondary elements like infrastructure damage, scheduled power outages and the condition of our suppliers operations.

Plants which have stopped operations

- Utsunomiya Plant of the Plastics Company (Utsunomiya city, Tochigi prefecture)

Plants which have resumed operations

- Tokyo Plant of the Glass Bottle Company (Sagamihara city, Kanagawa prefecture)
- Saitama Plant of the Glass Bottle Company (Kumagaya city, Saitama prefecture)

There are some other facilities which were damaged but they have already recovered and are returning to normal operations.

3. Influence on our performance

The full range of the influence on our performance caused by damage due to the earthquake is now being investigated. We will inform you as soon as it is determined.
